Dear Taxpayer:

This letter is regarding our conversation on Oct. 26, 2012, in which you requested an installment agreement to resolve your account balance with the IRS.

Based on our information about your financial situation, we set up an installment agreement for you for the tax period(s) shown above. Your payment is \$663.00, due on the 28th of each month, beginning on Nov. 28, 2012.

You've agreed to this installment agreement with the provision that your payment will change to \$1,083.00 on Apr. 28, 2013 and continue at that amount. Your payment will change again to \$1,478.00 on June 28, 2013 and continue at this amount for each month thereafter.

We'll send you a monthly statement with a payment voucher and return envelope shortly before each payment is due. It will show the total amount you owe, as well as your monthly payment amount. We must receive your payment by the due date, so if you don't receive the statement at least 10 days before your first payment due date, you should return the last page of this letter with your payment.

Make the check or money order payable to the United States Treasury. Include your name, address, Social Security or Employer Identification number, tax year, tax form and a daytime telephone number on each payment. Please use the return envelope provided. If you change your address, please enclose your new address with the next payment you send us. We must have your current address in order to maintain your installment agreement.

We'll apply any refunds to the amount you owe until your balance due is paid in full. We will not consider the refund as a monthly payment; therefore, even if we do apply a refund to your account, you must make
